A PERNICIOUS PATTERN OF DELUSION

"But he who is spiritual discerns all things" — 1 Corinthians 2:15

"But solid food belongs to those who are mature, even those who byreason of use have their senses exercised to discern good from evil.."—Hebrews 5:14

> *"Beloved, believe not every spirit, but test the spirits..."* —I John 4:1a

Discerning believers need to keep abreast of what is happening in false religious systems like Roman Catholicism and Eastern Orthodoxy (which seems to have appeal to some Evangelicals today but has never had a Reformation). The cults present a bewildering array of false teaching noted and analyzed in *The Discerner*. In my forty three years of association with Religion Analysis Service I have greatly appreciated the attention given to the content of these erring movements, but I have never seen a focus on some of the more subtle patterns of deception and delusion.

One of these I call the peril of false dichotomies or false adversatives. To be sure there are Biblical dichotomies and adversatives: we are either for Christ or against Him. We serve God or Mammon. There are only two paths and two destinies (Matthew 7:13-14, Psalm 1). In these critical issues it is an either/or, not a both/and. So Joshua, Elijah and our Blessed Lord called for making choices and decisions. To make no decision is in fact to make a decision. To live is to choose. We cannot hesitate and equivocate. We must go one way or another, and Christ is the only way.

But there are currently some areas in which a pendulum effect is to be observed. These are areas in which it is not either/or but in fact, both/and. I should like to submit some examples and you may think of others.

It is not the individual or the community - it is both

Fidelity to Scripture requires a recognition of the importance of both the individual and the community. Sometimes we harbor among us an exaggerated or Emersonian individualism which has no sensitivity to the Body of Christ. John Wesley was right in saying that "Jesus Christ alone saves but He never saves anyone alone." As part of coming to Christ we are incorporated into the body of Christ (1 Corinthians 12:13). We now belong to the "forever family of God."

Still we come to Christ as individuals. There is no such thing as mass conversions or group conversions. Receiving Christ, as our Savior and Lord is intensely personal. The operation of vicarious faith is not possible. Sometimes we are in danger of being swallowed up in the collectivisms of our time in what the late William Whyte saw as the danger of *The Organization Man.* Karl Barth argues that everyone is elected in Christ and N.T. Wright (good as he is on the bodily resurrection of our Lord) sees justification as corporate.

Individualism is not a naughty word and must be seen as an important part of what has made America great with opportunity for initiative and risk-taking. Perhaps we in the West have been overly preoccupied with individualism and we have seen individualism run amok in our churches.

But surely the "emergent church" is in serious error when it leans on Walter Wink's disparagement of "the atonement as a highly individual transaction between the believer and God" (in Brian Maclaren's very arrogant book, *The Secret Message of Jesus)*. Galatians 3 presents the beautiful and complementary balance between individual faith in Christ (3:10-12) and the glory and richness of the Christian community (3:26-29). This is not an either/or but a both/and.

Conversion is **not a point** in **time or a process -** it is **both.** Supernatural new birth according to the New Testament is an event, a moment in time-space when we cross the line from being in Adam to being in Christ. Not everyone is able to identify that exact point but there has to be a point of transfer from "darkness to light" (1 Peter 2:9). We do not ooze into salvation, we choose into salvation.

But some in their perception of an extended process are tending to depreciate the importance of immediate conversion. Here our doctrine of prevenient grace is vital - "The Hound of Heaven" is in pursuit of the sinner over many years, in some cases since childhood. The Holy Spirit makes a move and there is response, positive or negative. C.S. Lewis heard the pursuing steps behind him over a period of time and while riding in a side-car on his way to Whipsnade Zoo, he finally made his commitment. How much sowing and watering come before the harvest?

The Apostle Paul is prima-facie evidence of the balance: how long was it that he kicked against the goads of God? The Holy Spirit was at work as Paul held the coats of those who stoned Stephen. It is not really the final blow of the hammer that shatters the rock. Many preliminary/successive blows are required, and we never know how close we are to the implosion. It is not an either/or in this instance. We need both in a congenial and cogent balance.

It is not the personal or the propositional - it is both

So great is the antipathy of some to propositional revelation that they seek to demolish the cognitive altogether. Rationalism is a danger, but rationality is necessary for communication. Linear reasoning is used even by its opponents to attack it. The classic case of this confusion was the untimely article by William Willimon in *Christianity Today* (March 4, 1996) in which he advanced the foolishness that we need to jettison objective, propositional truth about Jesus and move to the personal.

This is to make a false disjunction. If we do not have objective facts about Jesus as set forth in Scripture we have no reality check on pure subjectivity. "Encounter theology" was the signature of neo-orthodoxy but without objective criteria from Scripture, how can one be sure that one is not encountering the Devil himself? Yet many today are so enamored with "feeling" and "experience" that they trash objective truth and factuality and bring only disaster upon themselves and their hearers. The objective fact of our legal marriage and its documentation fifty years ago does not deprive my marriage with the wife of my youth of one smidgeon of its personal and affective delight. The personal and the propositional are not mutually exclusive. We need both.

It is not doctrine or experience - it is both

Many in our times seem to have an allergy to doctrine. So the Apostle Paul predicted: "For the time will come when men will not endure sound doctrine..." (2 Timothy 4:3). Of course, we shall have doctrine whether we want it or not - the question will be whether or not it is sound doctrine. No doctrine is a doctrine. Some advise: "Don't preach doctrine, just preach Jesus." But anything we say about Jesus is doctrinal. "Tell stories, don't preach doctrine" others urge. A Biblical narrative which does not illustrate a doctrine taught in the didactic or epistolary sections of Scripture is just entertainment. Application must be "obeying from the heart that form of doctrine which was delivered" to us (Romans 6:17). There is such a thing as "the apostles' doctrine" (Acts 2:42).

While some traditions treasure doctrine but lean toward "dead orthodoxy," the tilt in our times is to seek experience. "I don't preach doctrine," Aimee Semple McPherson used to boast. Pietists have sought "the burning heart" as a concomitant of sound doctrine but their tendency has been to lose the doctrine. "New Age" religion is experience heavy but Biblically vapid. Demotion of the Scriptural text is lethal. "Feeling is believing" is the credo of some in our age. Downplaying the historicity of Biblical events is increasingly common. The truthfulness and facticity of the Scriptural record are "the launching pad from which the rocket of experience is launched". Can we have regeneration without John 3? Can we have justification by faith without Romans 3? What do we know about the Holy Spirit that is not communicated in the Word of God? Doctrine and experience are the "gold-dust twins," They are not contradictory but complementary.

It is not internally oriented or externally oriented - it is both.

Some have tended to introversion and some tend to extroversion and probably the most of us are ambiverts. We are in some balance between the two. In fact, we cannot surrender to either extreme - the inner directed person of David Reisman's description in *The Lonely Crowd* needs the balance of counsel and advice from a responsibility group or relationship. Jesus said: "By their fruits you shall know them" (Matthew 7:20). Faith is the inward and works are the outward, and James well argues that it cannot be the one without the other. Spiritual health requires balance.

The more contemplative and meditative person needs a push toward more effective articulation and expression. The "doer" must beware of theologically rootless activism which becomes shallow and thin. The preacher needs to be the scholar/saint" but must not barricade himself in his study lest he be like the minister of whom it was said, "He was invisible during the week and incomprehensible on the Lord's Day."

Succumbing to a false dichotomy can leave one's ministry in a shambles. Ministry itself can become a hiding place from the Lord. He calls us to the vital cultivation of the internal as well as to the rigorous expression of the external. This must not be an either/or. I have noted just five false adversatives and there are many more. Which others come to your mind? With due recognition of the true adversatives(Christ vs the world, for instance, as in Romans 12:2), we must beware of the false dichotomies which cripple and maim balanced Christian experience and ministry. We are in fact complete in Christ (Colossians 2:10). He makes us full-orbed and lacking in no good thing. May our thinking and living reflect this kind of balance and wholeness which is Christ's purpose in salvation that he brings to us (John 10:10).

ARMSTRONGISM: YESTERDAY AND TODAY

Many readers of The Discerner Magazine will recognize the name of Herbert W. Armstrong, the founder of the "Radio Church of God" and "The Plain Truth" magazine. Over the years I have written three articles in this magazine exposing this fraudulent minister and his heretical doctrines. An update is due now.

Background

In 1934, Armstrong began broadcasting his distinctive doctrines over a very small radio station in Oregon and began publishing his magazine called "The Plain Truth". Response was encouraging and then he founded the "Radio Church of God" which in 1968 was named "The Worldwide Church of God" to reflect his worldwide audience which now numbered in the millions. In the late 1980's his magazine circulation topped 8 million free copies per month, much larger than most major news magazines. The income to the national headquarters in Pasadena, California neared 200 million dollars annually. Membership in the Worldwide Church of God numbered 120 thousand persons. Membership was determined by counting those who gave 20-30 percent of their income to the ministry of Armstrong.

Churches were established in rented quarters across America, Canada, England, Australia, and New Zealand. Local Pastors were appointed and salaried from headquarters in Seventh Day Adventist fashion. Armstrong considered himself the "Pastor General" who controlled all matters of doctrine, organization, and practice. In order to staff all of these churches, Armstrong founded three colleges, one in England, another in Big Sandy, Texas, and the flagship school: Ambassador College in Pasadena.

Apostasy

From all outward appearances The Worldwide Church of God seemed monolithic. There was a gradual fallout as magazine subscribers and radio listeners detected the heresy that was being propagated. However, the growth far outnumbered the losses, so the cult continued to prosper. The first major split occurred in 1978 when Garner Ted, the fourth son of Herbert W., who for years was the national broadcaster for the radio and television programs, was expelled on charges of immorality and drunkenness. He immediately moved to Tyler. Texas where he founded "The International Church of God" along with a magazine and a television program called "The Armor of God", both of which continued to propagate the strange doctrines of his father. Garner Ted was finally ousted from his church over his continued immorality and charges of money mismanagement. Not to be stopped, he, in 2003, founded "The Intercontinental Church of God", along with a magazine and television broadcast. Garner Ted died of pneumonia in 2005. His church continues to function although on a much smaller and dwindling basis.

The next major player to go was Roderick Meredith, a close confidant of Herbert W. and the editor of the Plain Truth Magazine. A power struggle ensued, and he left in 1992 and founded "The Global Church of God" in San Diego, California. Shortly afterward, Meredith was fired, and so he moved to Charlotte, North Carolina where he established "The Living Church of God" and the headquarters for his association of churches. It was in one his branch churches near Milwaukee, Wisconsin where, in 2005, Terry Ratzmann gunned down the Pastor and seven others including himself, which received national attention. The primary reason for this killing was Ratzmann's conflict with the Pastor and the dictatorial teachings of the church, including the ruling that one cannot marry outside of Meredith's church.

Shortly after the death of Armstrong in 1986, his handpicked successor Joseph Tkach Sr. began to make some doctrinal and organizational changes which spawned a mass exodus. Tkach lists 104 organizations which have splintered from the Worldwide Church of God.

Mini-denominations

In the succeeding years, literally hundreds of these new groups and individual churches have been formed, and all of them trace their history and doctrinal distinctives to Herbert W. Armstrong and the Worldwide Church. Like their mentor, they all denounce each other as spurious while claiming to be the only true church on earth today. So the legacy continues. In addition to the conflict over doctrine, there was major concern over who would control the multiplied millions of dollars the Worldwide Church possessed. The properties in Texas and California were worth \$200 million alone, plus additional millions in investments and secret deposits, some in foreign lands. Then too, there was the continued potential for additional millions through the tithes of the remaining constituents.

All of these rival churches and fellowships use the name "Church of God", believing that this is the only true Bible name based on Acts 20:28. Some of the larger mini-denominations include:

The United Church of God (org. 1995) The Christian Biblical Church of God (org. 1979) The Restored Church of God (org. 1998) The Living Church of God (org. 1998) The Twentieth Century Church of God (org. 1990)

The largest and most influential is the Philadelphia Church of God of Edmund, Oklahoma. founded by Gerald Flurry (72), who was excommunicated from the Worldwide Church in 1989. Today, his mini-denomination openly endorses all of Armstrong's doctrines and recently entered a lawsuit with the Worldwide Church over the right to publish his many books and pamphlets. The Worldwide Church settled the lawsuit by selling the copyrights to nineteen books for \$3 million.

Flurry's weekly television program: "The Key of David" is seen on 6 nationwide networks, 180 individual stations, plus 19 satellite broadcasts in Canada, Latin America, The Caribbean, Europe, Australia, New Zealand, and South Africa. Flurry claims to have a potential listening audience of 700 million worldwide. The program can also be viewed on their website: www,keyofdavid.com.

In addition, Flurry publishes a beautiful and impressive news and prophecy magazine called: "The Philadelphia Trumpet" which rivals and surpasses Armstrong's "Plain Truth" magazine which he is obviously imitating. This magazine is sent free to multiplied thousands of "subscribers" worldwide. In true Armstrong fashion, Flurry uses his magazine articles to propagate his warnings about the end of the world and the return of Jesus Christ to usher in the peaceful and wonderful "world of tomorrow."

Heresies

To the uninformed reader and listener, the publications and programs sound evangelical and biblically based. Yet, cleverly and subtly woven into each of the propaganda pieces are the heretical doctrines of Herbert W. Armstrong which include:

1. <u>The failure of Christianity</u>. Armstrong and all of his followers believe that the true gospel was not preached for 1,900 years. It was finally restored when Herbert W. began his first radio broadcast in 1934, and continues today exclusively through Gerald Flurry. Interestingly, all of the splinter groups make the same claim for their particular church or fellowship of churches.

2. <u>God is a family of persons</u>. Flurry continually speaks of "Two Gods", meaning the Father and the Son, and he therefore denies the Trinity and the personality of the Holy Spirit. It also opens the door to the Mormon doctrine that people can become Gods and belong to the "God family".

3. <u>Salvation by works</u>. According to Flurry and all the descendents of Armstrong, salvation is a process consisting of repentance, faith, and baptism, which are valid only in their particular church. No one is saved in this life. True believers are "begotten" now. The new birth is realized in the final resurrection. In this sense, even Jesus needed to be born again. So far, Jesus is the only one to have received salvation.

4. <u>Sabbath keeping</u>. All of these cultic groups insist that Saturday is the only proper day of worship. Sunday worship, they claim, was initiated by the Roman Emperor Constantine in 325 A.D. Like Seventh-Day Adventism, they preach that Sunday observance is "the mark of the beast" of Revelation 13. Flurry says that without proper Sabbathkeeping a person will never be saved.

5. <u>Anglo-Israelism.</u> This false doctrine is the centerpiece of their understanding of history and prophecy. They believe that there were "ten lost tribes of Israel" after the Babylonian captivity in the fourth century B.C and that they migrated to Western Europe, the British Isles, and later to the United States. They claim that the tribe of Ephraim populated the British Isles and the tribe of Manasseh populated what would become the United States. Hence, the Old Testament prophecies are all about these descendents, and they are therefore the recipients of the promises made to David. This, Flurry believes, is the key to understanding Bible prophecy, and this is why he has named his television program: "The Key of David".

6. <u>Eternal punishment.</u> Flurry, in agreement with his mentor, rejects the idea of eternal punishment for the wicked. Death is the absence of life and no one will be punished in a fictitious hell. The hell of the Bible will eventually burn itself out, he claims.

7. Fulfilled prophecy. Flurry believes that Armstrong fulfilled Jesus' prophecy in Matthew 24:14: "This gospel of the kingdom will be preached in all the world." He also believes that the implosion of the Worldwide Church of God and the commissioning of The Philadelphia Church of God was foretold in Revelation 10:11, which says: "You shall prophesy again before many peoples, nations and tongues". Flurry also preaches what is known as the "Malachi Message", based on Malachi 2:4. This quote, taken completely out of context, reputedly supports his claim that God gives direct revelation regarding things to come only to him. These are revelations in addition to those previously given to Armstrong. Flurry's most recent revelation is that "the last half of the last hour" before the coming Great Tribulation began on June 4, 2005 and will culminate on January 16, 2010.

Reformation

Under the leadership of Joseph Tkach Sr, the Worldwide Church began to distance themselves from their founder by withdrawing from publication of all of his books. New biblical studies by Tkach led to a revision of the doctrine of the new birth, the acceptance of the Trinity and the Holy Spirit as a divine person. He also declared that WWC members are no longer under the Old Testament laws, and therefore all dietary restrictions, including the eating of pork were lifted. In addition, he renounced Sabbath-keeping and declared that true Christians are found in other churches beside their own,

Tkach died in 1995 and was succeeded by his son, Joseph Tkach Jr, who continued the reformation of the church. His

major reforms included an outright rejection of "Anglo-Israelism" and the "triple tithe" of personal income to the church. He also lifted the ban on Christmas and Easter celebrations and encouraged voting in governmental elections, military service, and law enforcement employment. In 1997 Tkach Jr, published "Transformed by Truth," defending the many doctrinal and administrative changes made by himself and his father. Because of these drastic changes, The Worldwide Church of God was welcomed into The National Association of Evangelicals that same year.

Consequences

Up to three-quarters of the church's 125,000 members have departed and the operational budget has shrunk from its high of \$210 million in 1990 to about \$30 million today. Forced to economize, the church layed off 200 of the 1,200 plus headquarters' staff and has sold the sprawling Texas College campus to Hobby Lobby, which, in turn, gave it to Bill Gothard's ministry. Ambassador University was closed and sold to a charismatic church. This included the lavish homes on Colorado Boulevard in Pasadena and the magnificent Ambassador Auditorium.

The Plain Truth Magazine has been severely scaled back and is now offered on a subscription basis only. The headquarters has moved to a new campus in Glendora, California. The church still maintains national offices in many countries. The church claims a membership of 60,000 in 860 churches in 90 nations (as of 2004). The most recent announcement from the Worldwide Church is a name change this year to "Grace International Communion." Bible believers can rejoice over these dramatic developments.

Out of this major cult has emerged a New Testament church that is impacting our world for Christ.

TV PREACHER AIMS AT THE MULTITUDES

A new interne/television evangelist has come to prominence in Florida. I am enclosing, first, some biographical and ancecdotal information about Mr. Keller and then allowing two devotionals to speak for themselves. RAS will be following this ministry as it embarks on its national TV ventures in July. (Editor)

EARLY YEARS

William H. Keller grew up in Columbus, Ohio, as the oldest son in a devout Methodist family. Keller says he found Jesus when he was 12 and planned to go into seminary to become a Methodist preacher. After his father died when Keller was 16, he worked summers to put himself through Ohio State University.

He was a natural salesman. During his junior year in 1978, when he ran out of money, Keller set up a mail-order company selling computers out of his mother's basement. He tallied \$5 million in sales the first year, quit school and scrapped plans for the seminary.

Keller later sold his company and invested in stocks. After losing everything in the 1987 stock-market crash, he turned to an insider-trading scheme, running illegal deals through an investment firm he started in the Cayman Islands. When the Securities and Exchange Commission filed a criminal suit against Keller in 1989, he told agents, in his words, to "go fly a kite."

"I was obnoxious. l was very arrogant," he said. "I was 30 years old, I'd made a lot of money, I was still living pretty high, living a debauched lifestyle."

Keller eventually served 30 months at a federal prison camp near Pensacola, where he earned a mail-order degree in biblical studies from Jerry Falwell's Liberty University.

After his release in 1992, Keller returned to Chicago and

became an itinerant preacher. He lived on less than \$20,000 a year, he says.

Frustrated that he couldn't reach audiences outside of church, Keller signed on as a consultant to a Christian TV network in Clearwater. But he quickly became disillusioned.

"To be very blunt, it's a hustle," he said.

WEBSITE LAUNCHED

Keller left and launched liveprayer.com in a cramped office in the back of Ace Motors, a St. Petersburg used-car lot run by retired police officer Clyde Walters, a supporter who gave Keller a free car and office.

With about 700 volunteers, most of them retired pastors, Keller responds to about 40,000 prayer requests that come to the website daily. He e-mails a daily devotional to more than two million people.

A couple of times a month, he asks for money. Recently, he has started to solicit donations on his TV show, telling viewers the money is needed to pay off his ministries' \$500,000 debt.

Keller launched his TV show, *Live Prayer with Bill Keller*, three years ago to compete with some secular talk shows in what Keller views as a battle for souls.

"I don't hold back the truth," he said. "I don't have a problem sitting in front of a quarter of a million people every night and telling someone they're going to Hell."

Keller's occasionally caustic style can get him into trouble – he receives up to 30 death threats a month, he said.

Other ministers who have publicly challenged Keller's fundamentalist views have found him aggressive and intractable. The Rev. Phyllis Hunt, pastor of the Metropolitan Community Church of Tampa, joined Keller in a panel discussion on religion and politics. The discussion quickly degenerated into a screaming match over the Bible and homosexuality, Hunt said.

"He was pretty predictable in identifying anyone who said they were gay or lesbian as sinners," Hunt said. "It was about who could shout the loudest."

RECENT TARGETS

Keller can be just as volatile on television. Among his recent targets: Oprah Winfrey, whom Keller derided as a "New

Age witch," the Mormon Church and Florida Sen. Bill Nelson. When callers challenge him, he can get testy. During a recent live show, a young man named Danny from Boca Raton criticized him for manipulating people. Keller turned on him.

"When you die, what's going to happen to you, Danny? Keller asked, glaring intently at the camera.

"According to you, I'm probably going to Hell in a handbasket," Danny said.

"That's exactly correct, Danny. But you know what? You don't have to," Keller said. 'I'm on [TV] to reach people like you. 'Cause let me tell you something, the day you die and stand before God, you're not going to be able to whine and moan and cry and go, 'Oh, nobody told me.' You've heard the story, you've heard the truth. According to God's word, your blood's not on my hands anymore, my friend."

For viewers who take offense at his show, Keller is characteristically blunt: "Last I checked, l didn't send somebody to your house to duct-tape you to a chair and put toothpicks in your eyelids to force you to watch the program."

"OPRAH'S CHURCH"

DAILY DEVOTIONAL MONDAY MAY 15, 2006 (Deuteronomy 13:5, Isaiah 9:15)

Rev. Oprah? Why Oprah is so dangerous. For the nearly 7 years Liveprayer has been around, I have continually exposed this New Age false-hope merchant and warned people of how dangerous she is. If Oprah Winfrey was simply another Hollywood entertainer I could care less about her. What makes her so dangerous is that while her program normally deals with the same subject matter the raunchy Jerry Springer program does, Oprah also deals with the very real day-to-day issues of life and uses her nationally-syndicated television program to tell people how to live. The authority she speaks from? Herself, OPRAH WINFREY!

We are living in a time where the better percentage of two full generations don't go to church. People still hit those difficult places in life and at those moments they are looking for help and for hope. Sadly, the Christian leaders of our day have abandoned the marketplace and secular television for the safety and prosperity of the "Christian trough." To *fill this void* in people's spiritual lives, along comes Oprah!

"With her television pulpit and the sheer power of her persona, she has encouraged and steered audiences (mostly women) in all matters, from genocide in Rwanda to suburban spouse swapping to finding the absolute best T-shirt and oatmeal cookie."

"She's a really hip and materialistic Mother Teresa,' says Kathryn Lofton, a professor at Reed College in Portland, Ore., who has written two papers analyzing the religious aspects of Winfrey. 'Oprah has emerged as a symbolic figurehead of spirituality.' "

"She's a moral monitor, using herself as the template against which she measures the decency of a nation," Lofton says."

"With 49 million viewers each week in the USA and more in the 122 other countries to which the show is distributed, Winfrey reaches more people in a TV day than most preachers can hope to reach in a lifetime of sermons."

"In a November poll conducted at Beliefnet.com, a site that looks at how religions and spirituality intersect with popular culture, 33% of 6,600 respondents said Winfrey has had "a more profound impact" on their spiritual lives than their clergypersons."

"Winfrey called her talk show her 'ministry.' "

"Marcia Nelson says that it's not going too far to call her a spiritual leader. 'I've said to a number of people - she's today's Billy Graham.' "

" 'Our culture is changing,' he says, 'as churches are in decline and the bulk of a new generation is growing up outside of religion. Instead, they're turning to the Church of Oprah."

"'People who have no religion relate to her,' Nelson says."

It is clearly established that Oprah Wiinfrey views herself as some sort of spiritual leader, and based on the 49 million viewers of her TV program, you can laugh at that notion but can't ignore the fact she has an incredible amount of influence over tens of millions of lives. Let me be dear. The danger of Oprah Winfrey is that like any cult leader, her version of the truth and her final authority are not from God but from herself! It has been clearly documented from transcripts that Oprah Winfrey may use the name of "God," and very rarely "Jesus," and use many "Christian" expressions, but so does the Mormon cult! The real prosperity Gospel. How many times have you turned on Christian television and heard a message on "prosperity?" On the screen was a man or woman wearing thousands of dollars worth of clothes, tens of thousands more in jewelry, speaking from a million dollar set or a multi-million dollar building. Their message was about prosperity and how God wants you to have a mansion, drive new luxury automobiles, wear the finest clothes, eat the most sumptuous food, vacation in far-off lands. They tell you from God's Word that you are the "head and not the tail," "the lender not the borrower," that "God owns the cattle on a thousand hills," "all the gold and silver belongs to Him," and the "wealth of the wicked is laid up for the righteous."

As you sit there watching, you start to get into their message. They tell you that you are the child of a King and you deserve to live like royalty. Their powerful words encourage you to believe that God will provide you with all of the riches this world has to offer. They tell you that the only thing keeping you from enjoying great prosperity is your faith. You simply need greater faith. They then explain to you how to attain greater faith. You see, according to these prosperity teachers your faith is tied directly to your bank account and how much you are willing to give to them! (Where do you think their prosperity comes from?)

You are then challenged to show how great your faith is by the amount of money you are willing to send to them. Though it is never said in words, It is dearly insinuated that the bigger the check you write, the greater your faith is. The verse in the Bible that these prosperity teachers routinely pervert is Luke 6:38, "Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you." Same reason. Their message doesn't work on people who have nothing to give them. That is why it is a false gospel. Our prosperity is NOT measured in our earthly treasures but in what we have stored up in heaven. The Bible is very clear that our wealth is not in the temporal things of this world but in the eternal things of God! Do you want to tell me that a person who loves Jesus, follows Christ daily, serves Him faithfully, yet lives in a small apartment in Siberia and has no material possessions is poor because they have no faith? The reality is God is blessing that person 100x greater than He is blessing someone who is saved and has all this world can offer in terms of material possessions, but is not fully surrendered or living their life for Him. Do you want to tell me God is not richly blessing someone who lives In Dallas, Texas who has a small 2-bedroom home, a mortgage, a 13-year-old car with 120,000 miles on it, basically living paycheck to paycheck but loves Jesus, is in the Word and prays daily, part of a local fellowship, serving the Lord in different ways, and honors Christ each day in how they live?

NEVER FORGET THIS. YOUR BLESSINGS FROM GOD ARE NOT MEASURED IN DOLLARS AND CENTS BUT IN THE CURRENCY OF HEAVEN! The Da Vinci Code (Dan Brown, Doubleday, 2003) is *everywhere*. The top selling book has produced a cottage industry. Millions have read the book and millions more are seeing the movie starring Tom Hanks. French tourism has also benefited from the Da Vinci effect. A trip to your local bookstore will display a whole range of books jumping on the Da Vinci Code bandwagon and exploring the themes of the book.

Was Jesus married to Mary Magdalene? Did Jesus and Mary Magdalene have a child named Sarah, whose descendants survive to this day, protected by a super-secret society called the Priory of Sion? Has the Christian Church suppressed the truth of the origins of Christianity for 2000 years in order to maintain their power, and suppress women? These questions and many more are raised in the Da Vinci Code.

Should Christians ignore this phenomenon? Some have chosen to do so. Many others have decided to follow the wisdom described by Joseph "You meant evil against me; but God meant it for Good (Genesis 50:20 NKJV). In other words, they have decided to turn this attack on the faith into an opportunity to share the gospel.
